General Info

- 6 week rotation (See color coded Weekly Schedule)-ALL students do same thing over course of 6 weeks, just in different order
- Make sure you have 3 continuous floor weeks, and 1 week of Amb/Elective/Nursery
 - 3 weeks Inpatient (2 or 4 Hope)- Randomly assigned
-Assigned to work with different intern each week
 - 1 week Ambulatory
 - AM Acute Care
 - PM Acute Care and One PM in Continuity Clinic
 - Okay to do subspecialty clinics for half-days
 - 1 week Well Baby Nursery
 - Meet with Nursery team on 2nd floor of Christ in the L+D department, be ready by 7:00 am- Start catching babies!
 - NICU Morning Report at 9:00 am
 - Will attend deliveries with Nursery team, come to work in street clothes, change into scrubs, NO JEWELRY!
 - Friday - 5 min presentations with team
 - 1 week Elective
 - Choose from list of subspecialties and turn PINK Elective Request Form into Ellen by the end of rotation week 1

- ICU/Surgical Subspecialties rotations not available as 1 week electives
- Daily Routine
 - 7:30AM – Morning Report
 - Everyday (M-F) except during Nursery week starts in AM Report (if Nursery week, just go straight to Nursery, unless post-call come to MR to present your admission)
 - Students should be prepared to present any admission from the previous night (or weekend for Monday AM Report)
 - Always state the resident you are working with on this pt.
 - 8:30-10:30AM – Work Rounds
 - Floor students see their patients with floor interns and begin to formulate SOAP notes- Review all questions/concerns with residents beforehand
 - Ambulatory students go to clinic
 - Elective students go to their elective service
 - 10:30AM – Attending Rounds
 - Sit-down rounds on all Floor patients
 - If a student is following a patient, that student presents on rounds
 - Start with 1-2 patients, move up accordingly
 - Noon-1PM – Work Rounds/Post-call resident sign-out
 - 1PM-4PM – Work Rounds, Admit new patients—feel free to work with child life, observe your patients having studies done, etc.
 - 4PM – Sign-out / Call Begins
- Call (see color coded Call Schedule)
 - Everyone check to see if you have 4 total calls
 - 1 Weeknight call (4PM-1PM following day-you may miss one lecture-Should never be on call Tuesday night; then you go home and return for AM report the next day) These calls should generally be when you are on the floors.
 - 1x Friday call (4PM-8AM; pair-up with an intern)
 - 1x Saturday call (8AM-8AM; pair-up with an intern)
 - 1x Sunday call (8AM-2PM; pair-up with an intern, you stay until after lectures on Monday)
 - All changes must be discussed with Ellen (NO q2 and no more than 4 students on at one time)
 - For each call, have your senior resident sign your call sheet (PINK sheet in folder)
 - PAIR UP WITH INTERNS ON WEEKENDS TOO
- Lecture (see Lecture Schedule)
 - ALL Lectures are in 4th Floor Conference Room unless otherwise noted.
 - Every Tues AM is Chief Rounds
 - First Wednesday of month is Pediatric Seminars, CME Event
 - Every Wed PM is a Quiz (Case-based, not multiple choice)

- Lecture notes are in binder and website for review before and after lectures
 - Lectures take precedence over everything else. So, if there is a lecture scheduled, you are expected to be there (all residents and attendings know this and will let you out of your clinical responsibilities to attend)
 - Lectures with Academic 3rd year Peds Senior are mandatory for all floor students; if on elective/nursery/clinic must attend lecture regarding fluids and electrolytes.
- Assignments
 - CLIPP Cases - completely run by the home university
 - Pt logs –either online (CMS/CCOM) or on paper (UIC)
 - Quizzes x6
 - Direct Observation Sheets (UIC-3)
 - UIC-5th Friday Quiz (6% of total grade)-return to Hope afterwards
 - CMS offsite lectures on Friday-return to Hope afterwards
 - CCOM one offsite lecture on a Thursday-return to Hope afterwards
 - UIC students enrolled in testing study through university
 - Case of the Week
 - Admission H&P's x4
 - COMPLETE History and Physical Exam with Assessment and Plan must be signed by the admitting Intern and placed in the chart ASAP. Reference in folder and on website.
 - Make a *photocopy* of the COMPLETE, SIGNED H&P and keep it for Morning report the next day (the ORIGINAL MUST be in the chart!)
 - Compose a differential diagnosis AND discussion of the case and attach it to the photocopy of the admitting H&P and turn it into Ellen after Morning Report.
 - Will not be accepted anytime after Attending Rounds on the post-call day.
- Evaluations
 - Dr. Mehta/Nelson/Lichten will meet with each student in the 3rd or 4th week of the rotation to review 2 Admission H&P's and the completed Quizzes.
 - Must have 2 H&P's turned in by the end of week 3!
 - Dr. Mehta/Nelson/Lichten will meet with each student in the 6th week of the rotation to review the remaining H&P's and Quizzes.
 - In addition to H&P's and Quizzes, a student's general performance in morning reports, on attending rounds, and daily work rounds will be taken into consideration for the final evaluation.
 - Must request...
 - 3 Attending Evaluations total
 - At least one must be from Dr.Mehta, Dr.Nelson, or Dr. Lichten

- Recommend one from Subspecialist during Elective week
 - Dr.Roy, Hospitalists, Chief Resident, Fellows okay for last evaluation
 - 3 Resident Evals
 - One from Senior Resident
 - Two from whomever else (strongly encourage you request evals from Pediatric Resident's).
- Tour
 - Make specific note of Ellen's desk and the H&P bin!
 - Floor/Clinic
- Finally...
 - Take your paperwork to the Security Office at the North Entrance to get ID Badges.
